There is also a memorial to George Peak-Garland in Heddington, Wiltshire (between Calne and Devizes); Formerly Sergeant in the Royal Wiltshire Yeomanry, killed at the Battle of Messines.

## Notes

2nd.-l.ieu. George Peak Garland, killed in action at Messines,

June 7th, 1917, aged 30. Eldest s. of James Peak Garland, of West Farm, Winterbourne Monkton, and formerly of Church Farm, Heddington. A sergeant in the Wilts Yeomanry at the outbreak of war he went to France in 1916, and early in 1917 was given a commission in the Inniskilling Fusiliers.
